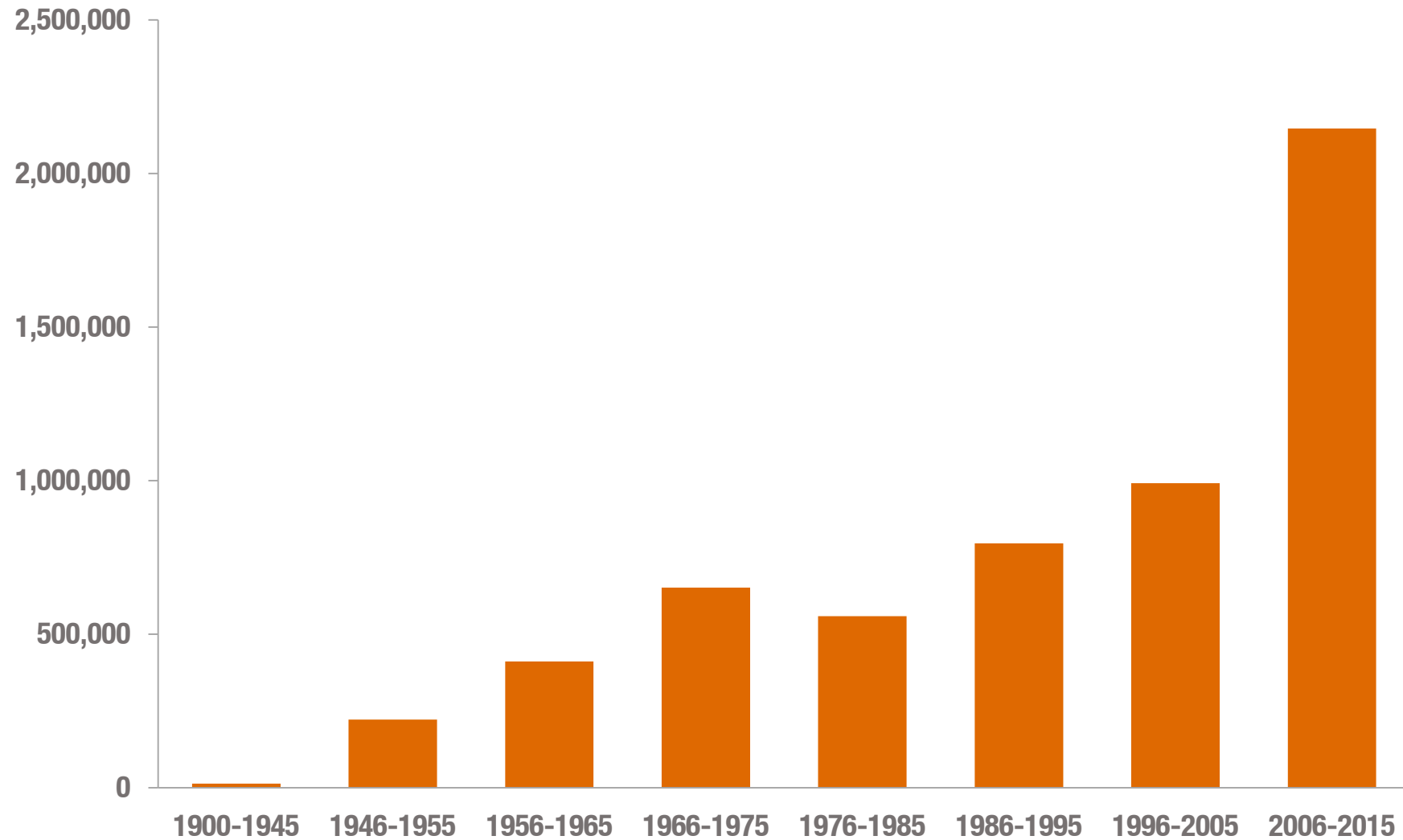

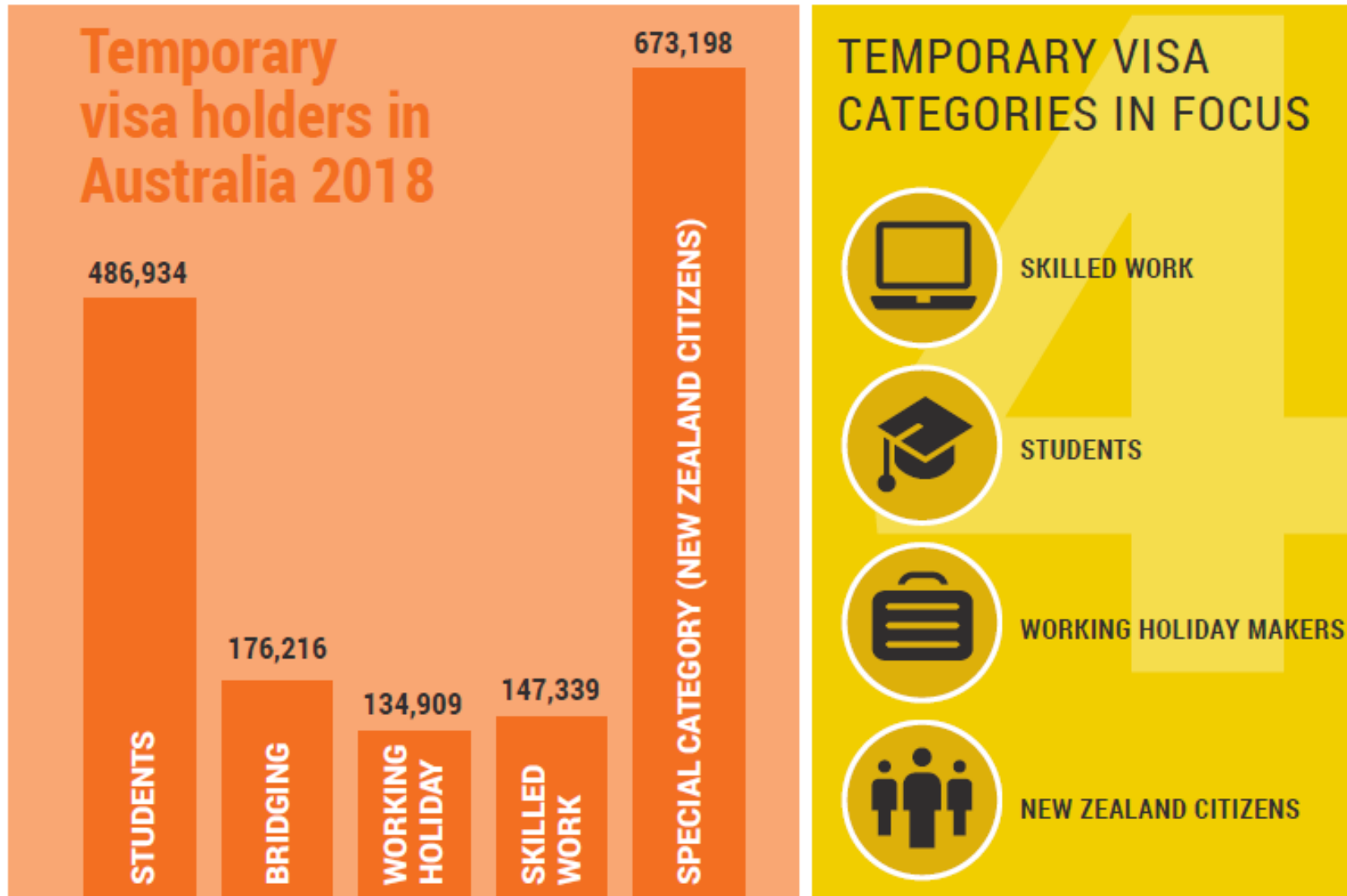

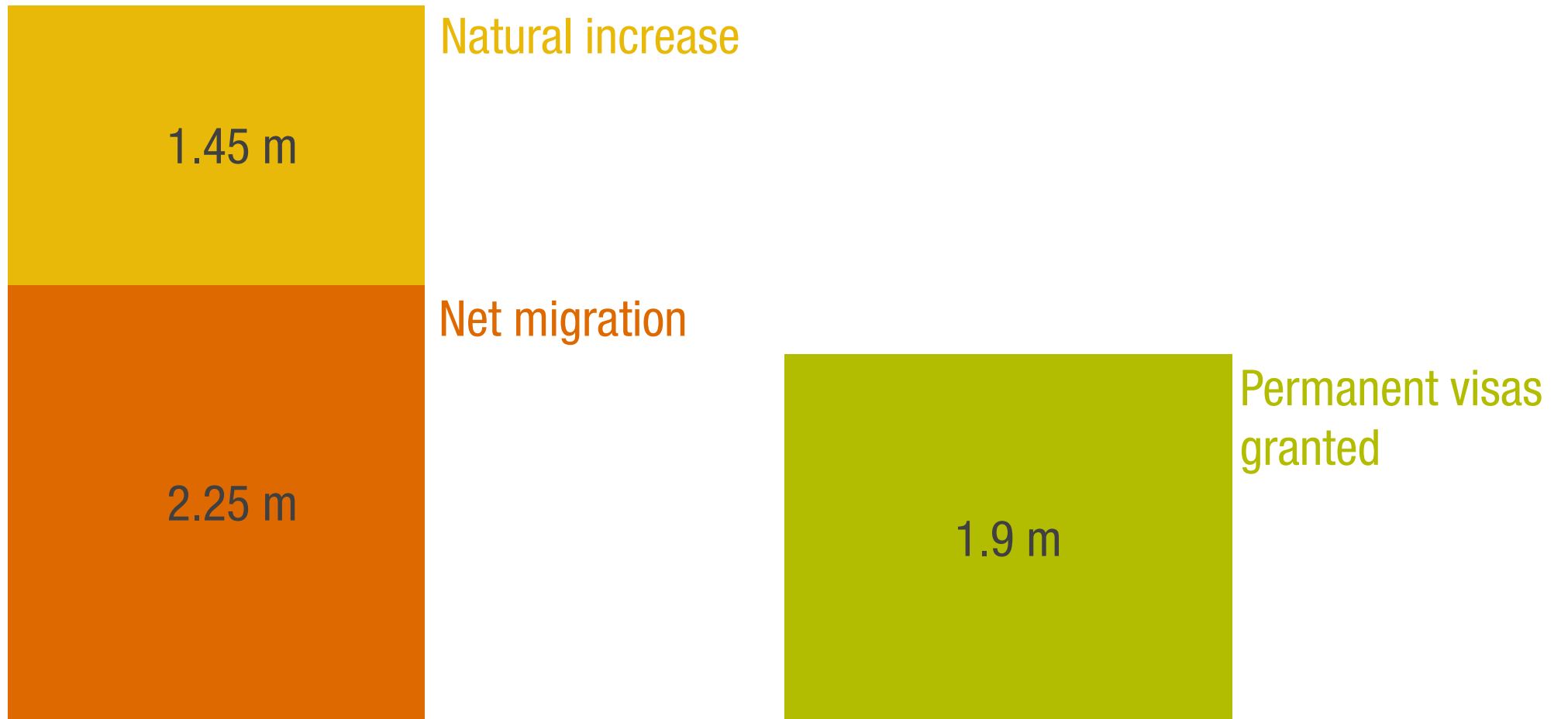
# Net Migration (by year of arrival)



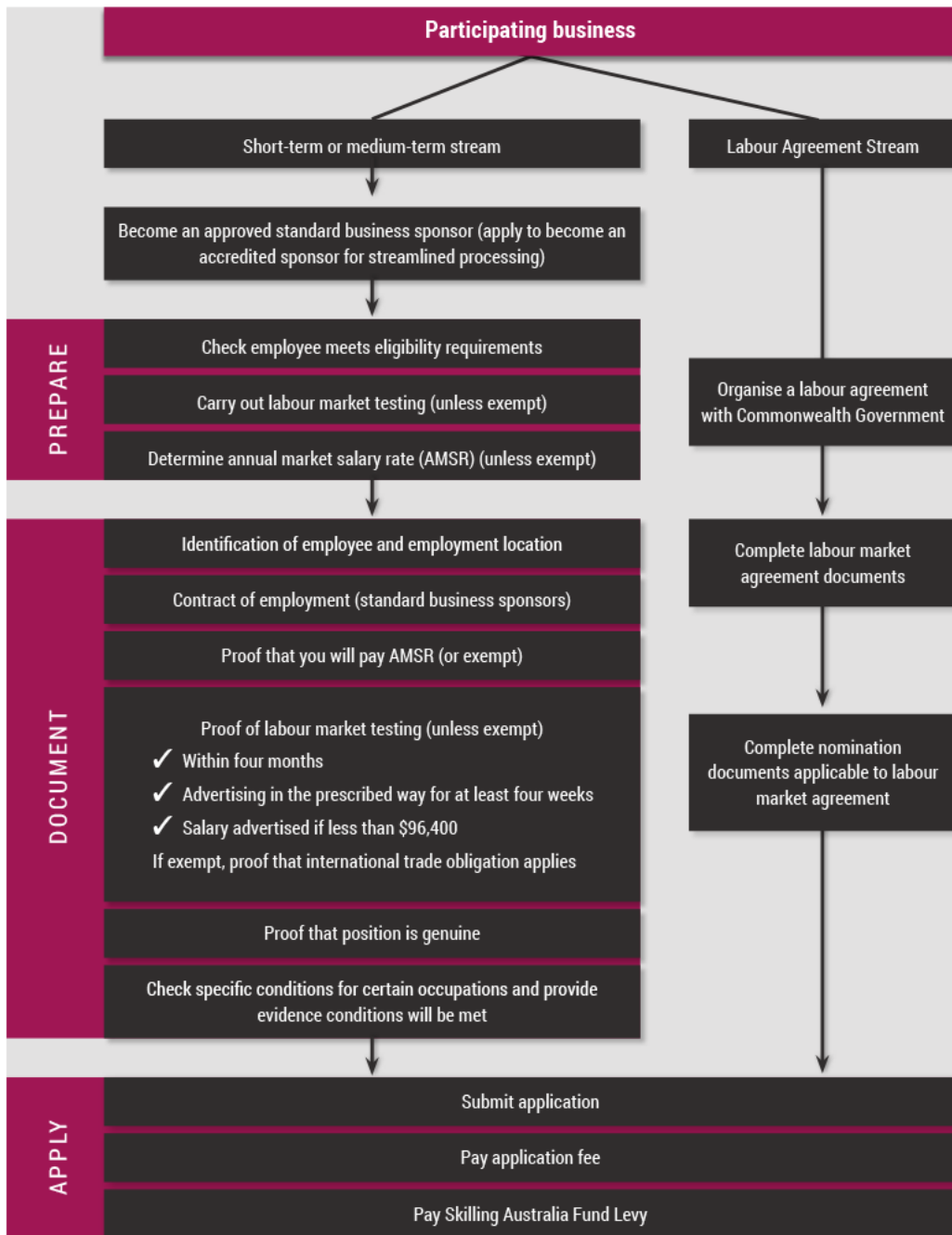
# Temporary visa categories and numbers



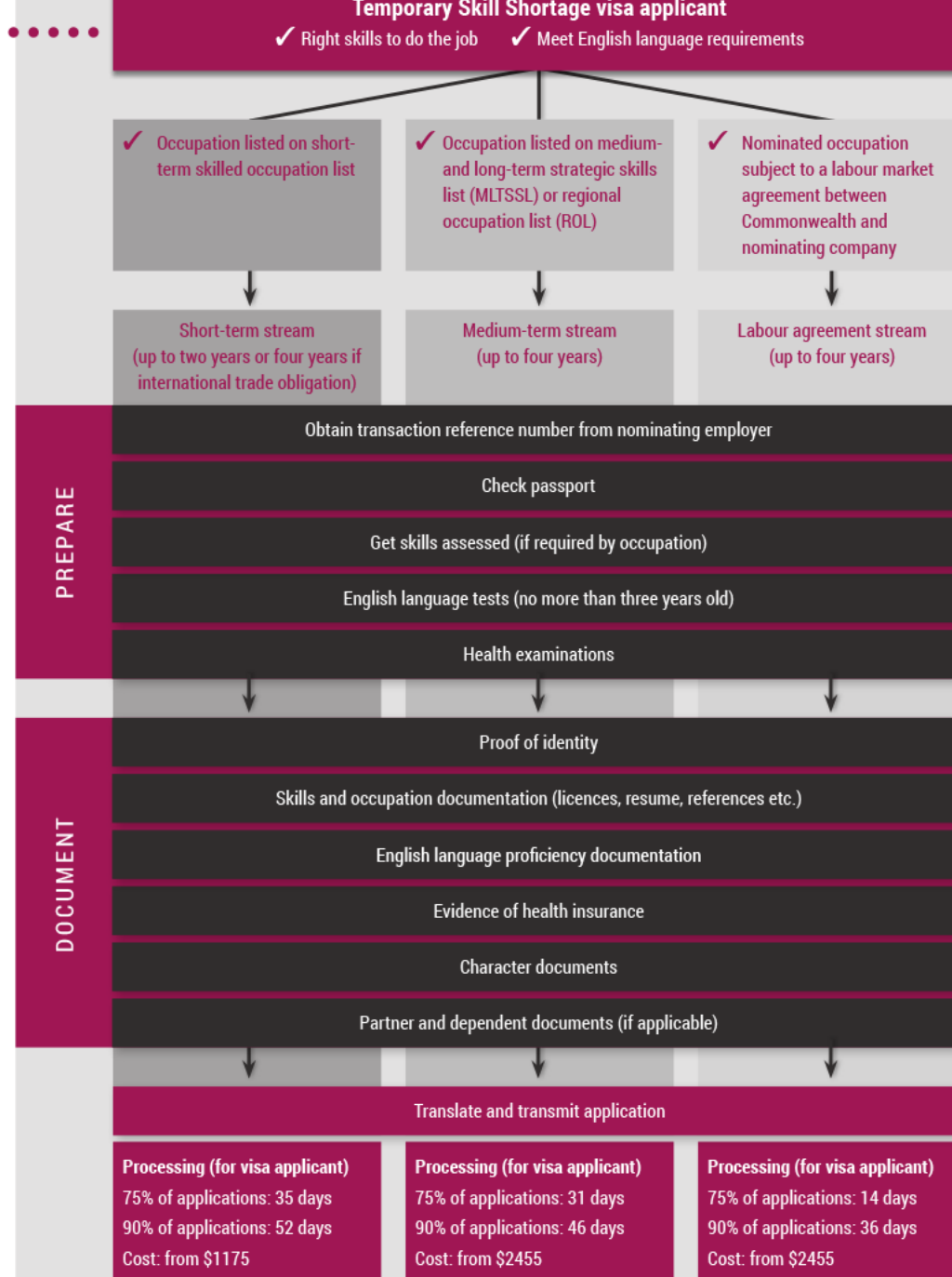
# Population growth (2007 to 2017)

# Recommendations

## **Actions that can be taken immediately:**

- Increasing transparency around the skilled occupation list.
- Aligning emerging labour trends to occupation codes.
- Creating a dedicated path for intra-company transfer of employees to Australia

# Additional recommendations

- Better aligning the Skilling Australia Fund Levy to alleviate the skill shortages.
- Creating an independent committee to analyse and consult on the skilled occupation lists.
- A regular Productivity Commission review of the temporary skilled visa program.
- Moving the levy collection to the visa approval stage.
