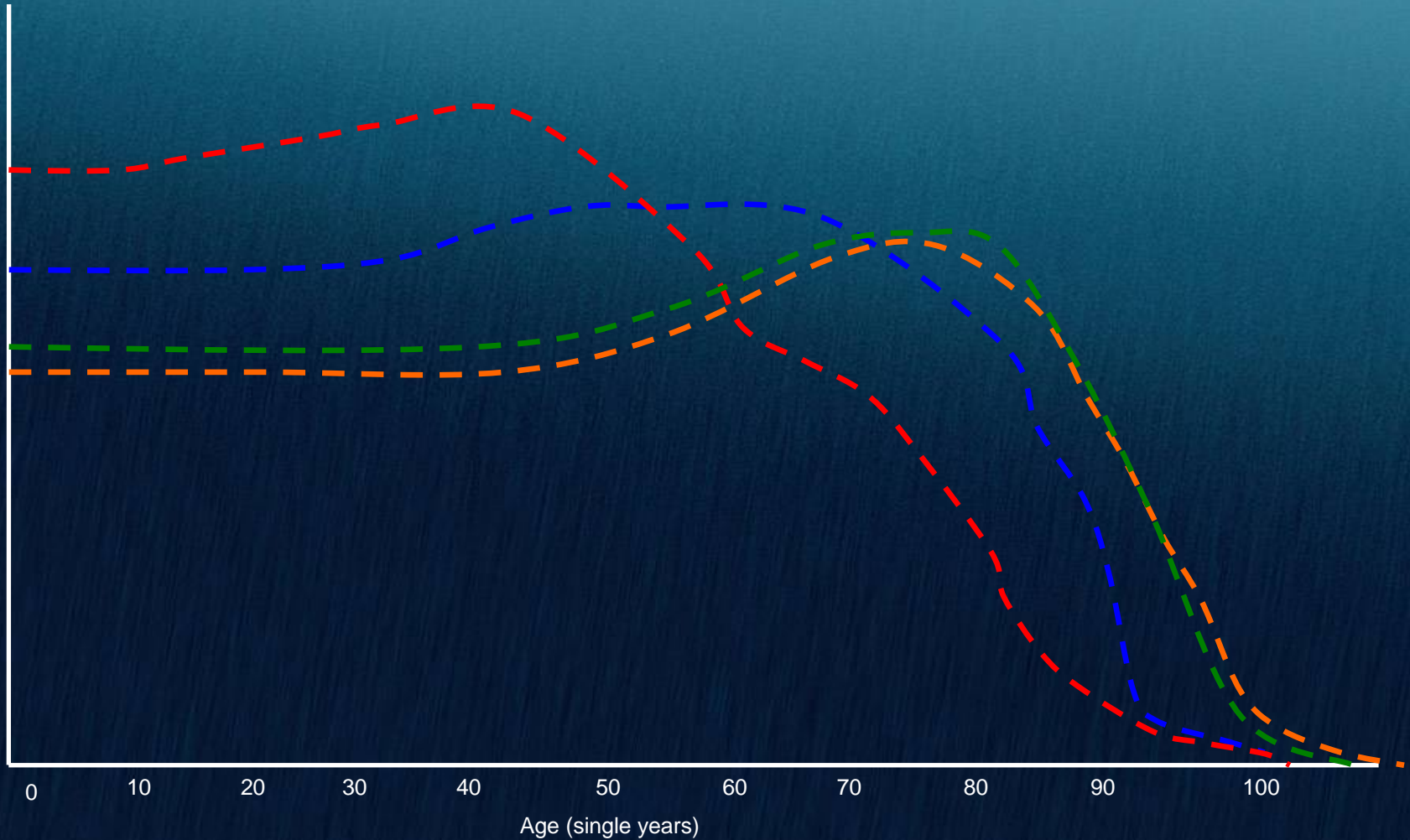

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Future Trends in Health and Health Expenditure

Health expenditure is rising and is an investment in people. International comparisons show Australia is already well placed to deal with ageing.



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Why are health costs rising?

- Population ageing is not the sole driver of health costs. Advances in medical technology and consumer demand also contribute to increases in health expenditure
- Actions to curb PBS growth are working



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Reducing the health bill

- Encouraging a good balance between public and private funding sources
- *The best and most effective way to reduce the need for services is to ensure that older people are healthy!*



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Chronic Disease – a focus on prevention

- Chronic diseases estimated to be responsible for more than two thirds of all health expenditure
- Diabetes, mental health, digestive disorders and the ‘obesity epidemic’
